From many perspectives, 2020 was a year like no other, across the country, in New York State, in our community and here at The Arc of Monroe. Despite the challenges of Covid-19, The Arc of Monroe and The Arc Foundation of Monroe proved to be adaptable and persevered with marked accomplishments.

From the beginning of the pandemic, we kept our residential services at all of our houses fully operational, with safety guidelines and staffing in place. We didn't skip a beat to continue our programs and services to people we support who were confined to staying at home and learned quickly the meaning of the words "working remotely" and "virtual meetings." We were able to offer Telehealth services to people so they could continue to receive Arc health services, like occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech, and counseling. ArcWorks, our manufacturing facility, was able to remain fully operational, and was even tasked to help with products related to Covid testing and vaccines.

From a financial perspective, we were able to counter the loss of revenue by securing funding for the costs associated with pandemic-related needs like PPE, staffing, and technology needed for those we support to stay virtually connected to their loved ones and services.

The Arc Foundation of Monroe had a successful year as well. During 2020, we received generous grants from several foundations (Mother Cabrini Health Foundation, Golisano Foundation, the United Way, the Konar Foundation, and JM McDonald Foundation) to help us through these difficult times, and our donors were as supportive as could be. We were able to hold our Day of Champions Golf Tournament, our Sporting Clays event and a "re-imagined" A Toast to The Arc at 6 unique venues of 50 or less guests in early October. And, we launched "Sibley's Christmas Adventure," a children's book written by Don Alhart. It was a beautiful way to bring cheer and nostalgia to the holiday season.

In December, we bid farewell and happy retirement to longtime Arc of Monroe CEO Barbara Wale, and Tracy Petrichick, The Arc's CFO took on additional responsibilities as Acting CEO during the search for this important role. We are grateful for the incredible support we have received, and we look forward to renewal and growth in 2021 so people of all abilities can reach their fullest potentials.



Distribution




Types of service



FUNDRAISING EVENTS



We were thankful to have the opportunity to enjoy the great outdoors at our annual Sporting Clays last spring. The tournament hosted 76 people and raised over \$19,000 in support of our mission.

This year's Sporting Clays Tournament is Tuesday, May 11, 2021 at Rochester Brooks International Trap & Skeet Club.

We were pleased to find a way to safely host our annual Toast to The Arc, where more than 250 people gathered in groups of 50 or less at six different locations.

This event raised over \$114,000 in support of our mission.

The Steve & Debbie Chartrand Scholarship Fund was established in 2015 to honor the retirement of Steve Chartrand, long-time Arc Foundation CEO. This endowment fund provides educational opportunities for The Arc of Monroe staff who are interested in furthering their career in the field of developmental disabilities. In 2020, The Arc of Monroe

dedicated The Chartrand Training Center in honor of Steve & Debbie Chartrand, outfitted with 20 brand new mini laptops and a state-of-the-art smart board.
